## THE 94TH ANNUAL TEXAS OKLAHOMA DISTRICT CONVENTION

The 94th TX-OK District Convention was held in Killeen, TX from Thursday, August 9 - Sunday, August 12, 2012.

### WEDNESDAY AUG 8

Although the Convention started on Thursday, the advance party made up of District Office staff and the Governor's team moved all the necessary items and equipment to Killeen on Wednesday to get the Convention materials ready for Thursday morning. A number of trucks were engaged to undertake this exercise. They had rain showers, a blessing, as they traveled to Killeen during this hot weather.

### THURSDAY AUG 9

Delegates started arriving for registration and accreditation. The first engagement was the Golf Tournament and it was only members who registered for it that took part in the event. It took place as early as 7:00 a.m. Registration went on from 11:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. daily. By 11.30 a.m. the Past Governors and their Spouses had lunch and this was by invitation only. This was followed by District Board Meetings for the 2011-2012 and 2012-2013 trustees. This was closely followed by the Spouses Reception hosted by First Dude & First Doc. It was by invitation only.

**WELCOME RECEPTION** The welcome ceremony was kicked off by Bill Herron, District Convention Co-Chair, with Governor Susan Hennum and First Dude Tom and other principal officers well seated at the high table. Bill, on behalf of Division 23, welcomed all to Killeen, Texas, hometown to Ft. Hood, the largest active Army duty post in the United States. He was confident that with the level of preparations done by them, that Kiwanians are bound to have a wonderful time throughout their stay. He urged members to visit the waterpark, wine tours, shopping and above all, interact with the people and have a feel of their warmth and friendship.

ELIMINATE - How to Touch Lives and Improve Life through The ELIMINATE Project. This Topic was given real attention and delegates took active part in the discussions. It was a very busy day as there were activities all through the day.

**SATURDAY AUG 11** Greg Samford, Human & Spiritual Values Chair, conducted the Prayer Service where many members, who have gone before us, were honored by having their name read allowed in remembrance. One from our club was remembers: Samuel E. West.

She is currently employed at First National Bank Texas as the Quality Assurance Officer. Although she is not a Kiwanian, her community involvement extends to a great degree. She is like the Eveready bunny; she keeps going and going, "I love being a servant because I enjoy seeing others face when you give unselfishly from the heart," is her answer to why she stays so busy. Her presentation was centered on 25 Years of Women in Kiwanis. She gave an Overview of the work and the role women have played in the growth and development of Kiwanis since 1987. They have held and are still holding various offices including that of club President, Secretary, Governor and Lt Governor among others. According to her, the sky is the limit of the women in Kiwanis. She said that women play several roles in the family, in the community and society at large. Governors and that of 2012-2013 Staff/Officers. Presentation of Governor's Gift was presented by the Chairman of Past Governors, Bill Bishop. This was followed by remarks by Governor-designate Ann Wilkins. Passing of banners was performed by Governor Susan's Garland Kiwanis Club to the Tahlequah Kiwanis Club of incoming Governor-designate, Ann Wilkins.

**COMEDY SHOW** John Branyan Comedy Show took the center stage and entertained the audience. He was very good at his Show that people laughed, jaws ached and sides cramped due to continuous laughing.

**SUNDAY AUG 12** There was an early morning ELIMINATE Walk performed members. This was followed by departure by members.
